WWCR MARKS 10 YEARS OF BROADCASTING

Reaching the World From Nashville

In June of 1989, WWCR-International went on the air with its first 100,000 Watt shortwave radio transmitter. Now, after 10 years of growth, WWCR uses 4 state of the art transmitters, broadcasting globally 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Our diverse programming reaches across the world, originating from our modern production and broadcast facilities northwest of downtown Nashville.

WWCR originally used the Harris Corporation's SW-100B transmitters, having three of them on the air prior to our fire. In April 1993, a devastating fire totally destroyed the station's facilities. Within 38 days of the disaster, WWCR was back on the air with a new Model 418-E transmitter, from Continental Electronics of Dallas. Since that time, WWCR has added three additional transmitters for a total of four, each carrying separate programming.

WWCR uses a total of 10 different frequencies each day to carry over 400 weekly programs to their target areas. Programs reach daily into Europe, the Middle East, Africa, Australia, New Zealand, North, Central and South America.

WWCR is the sister station to WNQM, 1300-AM (Nashville Quality Ministries, 50,000 Watts). 1300-AM in Nashville broadcasts 24 hours a day and has been on the air continuously since 1947. Over 100 different churches, teachers and ministries from Middle Tennessee and across the United States are heard over WNQM.
